

On October 22, 2007 at 11 a.m., Michaels Military Housing opened 33 new homes that comprise Cheyenne Village, the newest residential neighborhood on Fort Leavenworth, in a grand opening ceremony at 812 Iowa Avenue. Representatives from the Department of the Army, Fort Leavenworth, and executives from Michaels Military Housing were present for the official ribbon cutting ceremony. A special guest was, the Sergeant Major of the Army, Kenneth Preston.

Over the next seven years, MMH will demolish approximately half of the homes on the post and construct new ones, as well as perform major and minor renovations to existing homes. Cheyenne Village represents the second of these newly constructed neighborhoods.

The homes in Cheyenne Village will be made available to senior non-commissioned officers. There are three and four bedroom homes, as well as handicapped accessible homes. All of the Cheyenne Village homes feature wall to wall carpeting, oak cabinetry, oversized two-car garages, and full landscaping.
